## POISONOUS HOUSEPLANTS AT A GLANCE

Plants that endanger humans can also be dangerous to our pets. That is true of cats, dogs, caged birds, rabbits, hamsters, guinea pigs—any pets that roam freely in the home. If cats are not allowed outdoors every day to satisfy their need for grass, they will begin to nibble the houseplants, including the poisonous ones. It is wrong to believe that animals know instinctively what is good for them and what is not. Always put a bowl of cat grass on the windowsill for your room tigers. They love to nibble on umbrella sedge, which does not endanger them and which is sufficiently robust to constantly replace the damage with new shoots. Prickly specimens also hurt animals. Chasing flies at a window has netted many a cat prickles instead of booty. The small wounds often need many weeks to heal.

Dogs, too, get hurt- for example, by the points of agaves. Because both dogs and cats will drink any water, they are also endangered by plant remedies and fertilizers that have been dissolved in leftover plant water.

The strongest poisons in the world are produced by plants. A particularly poisonous specimen is the Adenium obesum., which belongs to the Apocynaceae family. It is absolutely essential to avoid contact with its latex. There are plants that are poisonous in all their parts, others that have only poisonous leaves or fruits, and still others that contain poisonous latex. The table below lists the best known house, balcony and container plants, and directs attention to the dangerous parts.
