

Blueberry Information Chart



For more fruit, CHOOSE 2 of the same or different Cultivars from the same Season or overlapping Seasons, i.e. Early to Mid or Mid to Late. Plant tags indicate season. Highbush & Lowbush do not cross pollinate.

Highbush Blueberry Fruit is medium to large in size, usually light blue and firm.

| Common Highbush Cultivars | Season Bloom - Fruit | Shrub Habit height x width and other notes | Highbush Pruning Prune in Early Spring |
|---------------------------|-------------------------|--|--|
| Duke | Early | Max 4'x6', Slightly tart | Fruits on current season's wood so prune early to encourage better fruit production. |
| Patriot | Early | Max 5'x5', Fiery orange-red Fall foliage | |
| Bluecrop | Midseason | Max 6'x4', Most adaptable | |
| Bluejay | Mid to Late season | 6'x6', Fruit holds on bush for a long time | |
| Jersey | Mid to Late season | Max 8'x5', Favorite for baking | |
| Legacy | Late | 6'x6', Retains golden Fall foliage into winter | |

Lowbush Blueberry Fruit is pea-sized, blue to black in color and firm.

| Native Lowbush | Season Bloom - Fruit | Shrub Habit height x width and other notes | Pruning |
|---------------------------------|-------------------------|---|---|
| Vaccinium angustifolium-Species | Midseason | Max 18"x24", Exposure: sun/ part shade | Not necessary each year but responds well to shearing back by two-thirds every 2nd or 3rd year. |
